### 9 December: MelNet AGM & Media Training

The MelNet AGM will be held in Wellington on Friday 9 December at 12.30 pm at the offices of the Health Promotion Agency.

# 24 March 2017: Auckland Skin Lesions & Dermatoscopy Course

Conducted by Honorary Associate Professor Amanda Oakley, this one-day course will be held as part of the <u>Goodfellow Symposium</u> in Auckland on 24 March 2017.

The course will address clinical and dermatoscopic diagnosis of common benign and malignant skin lesions, particularly pigmented lesions. All health professionals undertaking skin examinations are invited to attend, whether new to or experienced in dermatoscopy. MelNet members will be notified when registration opens.

## 18-21 October 2017: 9th World Congress of Melanoma

The 9th World Congress of Melanoma will join with the Society for Melanoma Research to bring together the world's leading melanoma researchers and clinicians to showcase the latest developments in melanoma diagnosis, treatment and research. It will cover the entire field of melanoma and other cutaneous malignancies. This joint meeting will be held in Brisbane from 18-21 October 2017. Abstracts must be submitted before 7 May 2017.

## 8th AJCC Cancer Staging Manual

Melanoma classification in New Zealand currently follows the AJCC 7th Edition. The melanoma chapter in the recently released 8th edition includes important changes to the T1 classification. A summary of these changes is available from the MelNet Coordinator.

## **New Australian clinical practice guidelines**

In 2008 New Zealand and Australia co-published the "Clinical Practice Guidelines for the Management of Melanoma in Australia and New Zealand". In light of the advances in melanoma diagnosis and management, new Australian <u>guidelines</u> are in the process of being developed in an incremental way using an electronic "wiki" platform. The four chapters completed thus far are:

- Type of biopsy
- Clinical features and atypical melanoma
- When is sentinel node biopsy indicated?
- Recommended definitive margins for excision of primary melanoma.

The provisional status of New Zealand's "Standards of Service Provision for Melanoma Patients in New Zealand - Provisional" is not due to be addressed by the Ministry of Health until 2018.
