#### Notice of MelNet AGM - 2 November 2018

The MelNet AGM will be held at the Cordis Hotel, Auckland from 5.15 – 5.45pm on Friday 2 November 2018, in conjunction with the 2018 New Zealand Melanoma Summit.

Members are invited to submit nominations for the Executive Committee in writing to the <u>MelNet</u> <u>Coordinator</u> no later than **5.00 pm Friday 19 October 2018**. These should include the nominee's name, a brief biography and the signatures of two members.

According to MelNet rules, the Committee shall comprise at least eight and no more than ten members, with occupations that span the continuum. Members who will be serving the second year of their twoyear term are a health promoter, a plastic surgeon, a surgical oncologist and a plastic surgeon/senior lecturer. Up to six additional members can be elected to the committee at the AGM. Preference will be given to those with oncology, GP, nursing, dermatology, pathology and research expertise.

Members are also invited to submit any remits or other matters to be considered at the AGM to the <u>MelNet Coordinator</u> no later than **5.00pm Friday 19 October 2018**.

Melanomas possibly missed Otago Daily Times 20 August 2018

Nodular and thick melanomas may be being missed by doctors in New Zealand who are using the traditional 'ABCDE' method of diagnosing melanoma, according to a recent University of Otago study led by Dr Mary-Jane Sneyd. Dr Sneyd suggests greater public and physician education on the characteristics of nodular and thick melanoma is needed, with patients being strongly encouraged to seek early physician advice. She also suggests additions to the 'ABCDE' method of diagnosing could be useful.
