Following the Melanoma Research and Therapy Special Interest Group meeting, MelNet is seeking expressions of interest from clinicians to participate in a retrospective review of 100 New Zealand metastatic melanoma patients.

This review would be in collaboration with the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research (WEHI) and funded by pharma.

#### Recent NZ publication: SunSmart accreditation and use of a professional policy drafting service

This recent New Zealand study, published by researchers at the Cancer Society Social and Behavioural Research Unit, investigates two internationally relevant sun protective interventions as predictors of hat policy strength:

- (1) skin cancer primary prevention programme membership
- (2) use of a professional policy drafting service.

Results showed that SunSmart accredited schools and those utilising a policy drafting service were significantly more likely to obtain the most protective hat scores.
