International melanoma trial | MelMarT-II

The MelMarT-II trial is gathering melanoma experts from around the world, including New Zealand, to contribute results from 3,000 patients to determine the optimal surgical excision margin for melanoma of the skin. The trial, led by Melanoma and Skin Cancer Trials, has already enrolled over 600 patients at 33 hospitals in seven different countries, and a recent agreement with the SWOG Cancer Research Network will allow for approximately 50 more sites across the USA.
