## Quality Statements to Guide Melanoma Diagnosis and Treatment in NZ | Now available online

The 'Quality Statements to Guide Melanoma Diagnosis and Treatment in New Zealand' are now available on the [MelNet website](#). Developed in collaboration with the Cancer Control Agency, this document is an evolution of the Standards of Service Provision for Melanoma Patients in New Zealand – Provisional which were drafted by the National Melanoma Tumour Standards Working Group for the Ministry of Health in 2013. It defines evidence-based protocols for melanoma prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and follow-up, and will inform efforts to reduce the incidence and improve outcomes for melanoma patients and their families.

We encourage you to share the document widely in your networks.

As owners of this piece of work, MelNet will endeavour to ensure it is updated regularly to reflect the latest evidence. If you would like to be part of the National Melanoma Working Group responsible for reviewing and updating the Quality Statements, please advise the [MelNet Chief Executive](#) of your interest by 4 February 2022. Reviews will be held twice yearly, with the first review coinciding with the Summit in February.

## Recent releases

New melanoma research published by Dr Tim (Wei) Wang from the Crown Princess Mary Cancer Centre, Westmead Hospital, Australia, has shown the concurrent use of two drugs that slow the growth of metastatic melanoma, Dabrafenib and Trametinib, are safe to use during palliative radiation therapy.

The study found these BRAF inhibitor drugs, which were previously reported to increase toxicity, had no grade 3 or 4 radiotherapy related toxicities. The phase I/II trial 'CombiRT' trial studied 10 patients and was developed and led by [MASC Trials](#).
